European Research Council

Established by the European Commission

European Research Council (ERC) funding schemes are open to top researchers of any nationality or age who wish to carry out their frontier research in the 28 EU Member States or associated countries.

Grants & Fellowships 1European Union

1.1 Horizon 2020

Horizon 2020 is the EU funding **programme** for research and innovation running from 2014 to 2020 with a €80 billion budget. H2020 supports <u>SMEs</u> with a new **instrument** that runs throughout various funded research and innovation fields, enhances EU <u>international research</u> and Third Country participation, attaches high importance to integrate <u>social sciences and humanities</u> encourages to develop a gender dimension in project.

Horizon 2020 offers a large variety of funding opportunities for research and innovation activities through calls for proposals that are set out in the Horizon 2020 work programme. Access all open calls on the Horizon 2020 Participant Portal.

The European Commission published an overview of **international cooperation opportunities in the H2020 work programme 2016-2017**, including a list of calls targeting Brazil. The list can be found here.

The Brazilian National Council of State Funding Agencies (CONFAP) listed potential calls of interest for EU-Brazil cooperation in order to encourage the participation of Brazilian researchers under Horizon 2020 calls. Some of them are currently open in diverse areas.

Several FAPs (<u>FAPESP</u>, <u>FAPESC</u>, <u>FAPEG</u>, <u>FAPEMIG</u>, <u>FAPDF</u>, <u>FAPES</u>, <u>Fundação Araucária</u>, <u>FUNDECT</u>) expressed interest in funding researchers from their states to support their participation in H2020 calls and published guidelines with instructions to this end.

1.2 ERC Starting Grants: Forthcoming call!

European Research Centre (ERC) Starting Grants are designed to support excellent Principal Investigators at the career stage at which they are **starting their own independent research team or programme in all scientific fields**.

The call is due on 3 August 2017. Expected Deadline: 17 October 2017

ERC Starting Grants in brief:

- For researchers of **any nationality** with **2-7 years of experience** since completion of PhD (or equivalent degree) and scientific track record showing great promise
- An excellent research proposal
- Research must be conducted in a public or private research organisation located in one of the EU Member States or Associated Countries (including Switzerland)
- Funding per grant: up to € 1.5 million (in some circumstances up to € 2 million). An additional € 0.5 million can be made available to cover eligible "start-up" costs for researchers moving from a third country to the EU or an associated country and/or the purchase of major equipment and/or access to large facilities.
- Duration: up to 5 years
- Sole evaluation criterion: scientific excellence of researcher and research proposal
- Calls for proposals: published once a year



Brazil and ERC:

About **ERC**:

Set up in 2007 by the EU, the <u>European Research Council</u> is the first pan-European funding organization for frontier research. It aims to stimulate scientific excellence in Europe by encouraging competition for funding between the very best, creative researchers of any nationality and age. The ERC also strives to attract top researchers from anywhere in the world to come to Europe. It funds young, early-career top researchers (<u>'ERC Starting grants'</u>), already independent excellent scientists (<u>'ERC Consolidator Grants'</u>), and senior research leaders (<u>'ERC Advanced Grants'</u>).

Please, note that ERC grants support projects carried out by an individual researcher ('Principal Investigator') who can **employ researchers of any nationality as team members**. It is also possible to have one or more team members located in a non-European country.

Vacancies for team members interested in joining an ERC led research project, can be published on the <u>Euraxess-Jobs portal</u>.

1.3 MSCA Co-Funding of regional, national and international programmes (COFUND) call

Aims to stimulate regional, national or international programmes to foster excellence in researchers' training, mobility and career development, spreading the best practices of Marie Sklodowska-Curie actions.

The COFUND call is open to European research (funding) institutions, Brazilian organisations can be partner organisations in a proposal. COFUND supports many high-quality fellowships or doctoral programme positions, which include transnational mobility.

Brazilian researchers can apply directly to COFUND positions advertised on the EURAXESS job portal.

Deadline: 28 September 2017.

1.4 MSCA PhDs positions in applied superconductivity : the EASITrain Innovative Training Network


EASItrain is an Innovative Training Network under the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA), bringing together industry, universities, laboratories and test-facilities in order to innovate and train **young scientists and engineers** in all aspects related to **applied superconductivity**.

EASITrain is a 4-year project providing a training network for the career development of **15 Early Stage Researchers** (ESRs) on superconducting wires, superconducting thin films, related manufacturing and processing techniques and innovative cryogenic refrigeration. Each ESR is funded by the project for **36 months** and will be enrolled in a **doctorate program**me. The project starts on 1 October 2017.

Deadline: 2 October 2017

1.5 Fellowships for research stays at the European University Institute (EUI)

1.5.1 Jean Monnet Postdoctoral Fellowships



The three main research themes of the RSCAS are:

- Integration, Governance and Democracy;
- Regulating Markets and Governing Money;
- 21st Century World Politics and Europe



1.5.2 Fernand Braudel Incoming Senior Fellowships

Fellowships last for **up to ten months** in one of the EUI's four Departments which in turn invite fellows to participate in departmental activities (seminars, workshops, colloquia, etc.).

Fellows are encouraged to make contact with researchers sharing their academic interests, may be involved in the teaching and thesis supervision tasks of EUI professors, and associated with one of the research projects being carried out at the EUI.

Next deadline: 30 September.

1.6 <u>Human Frontier Science Programme (HFSP)</u> Postdoctoral fellowships

HFSP postdoctoral fellowships encourage early career scientists to broaden their research skills by moving into **new areas** of study while working in a **new country**. Two possibilities:

- Long-Term Fellowships (LTF) are for applicants with a Ph.D. in a biological discipline, who will broaden their expertise by proposing a project in the life sciences which is significantly different from their previous Ph.D. or postdoctoral work.
- Cross-Disciplinary Fellowships (CDF) are for applicants with a Ph.D. from outside the life sciences (e.g. in physics, chemistry, mathematics, engineering or computer sciences), who have had limited exposure to biology during their previous training.

HFSP fellowships are for **three years**. Fellows may choose to stay for up to three years in the host country or use the last year of their fellowship to return to their home country or to move to another HFSPO member country.

Deadline : initiation deadline: 10 August 2017; Submission deadline 24 August 2017





HFSP fellowships are open to candidates of all nationalities. Those who are not nationals from one of the supporting countries may apply to work only in a research institution in one of the supporting countries.

1.7 EU – IIASA Postdoctoral Research programme

Every year the International Institute of Applied Systems Analysis (IIASA) located in Laxenburg, Austria, provides full funding for several postdoctoral researchers of all nationalities.

The Postdoctoral Program at IIASA offers fully funded research positions of up to **two years** to study topics related to the IIASA research agenda.

Scholars are expected to conduct their own research in collaboration with one or more of IIASA's research programs or special projects.

WHO? Researchers in **natural and social sciences**, **mathematics**, **engineering**, **management and decision sciences** who have their **PhD** at the time of taking up the appointment and are expected to have a proven record of research accomplishments, and a solid working knowledge of English.

Applications are accepted continually, review and selection take place twice a year.

Next deadline: 1 October 2017

1.8 <u>European Southern Observatory (ESO) fellowships</u> and studentships

The European Organisation for Astronomical Research in the Southern Hemisphere - European Southern Observatory (GERMANY, CHILE) offers the following opportunities:

 Postdoctoral Fellowships offer outstanding early-career scientists the opportunity to further develop their independent research programmes in an exciting scientific environment with close contact to the activities and staff at ESO. Duration: 3-4 years

Deadline: 15 October 2017.

- <u>ESO Studentship Programme</u>: These positions are open to students enrolled in a university Ph.D. programme, preferentially but not necessarily in an ESO member state in astronomy or related fields..

Students accepted into the programme work on their doctoral project under the formal supervision of their home university, but they come to ESO to work and study under the co-supervision of an ESO staff astronomer, normally for a period of between one and two years. Studentships may be hosted either at ESO's Headquarters in Garching (Germany) or at ESO's offices in Santiago (Chile), where up to two positions per year are provided for students enrolled in South American universities.

Deadlines: 15 November 2017; 31 May 2018

1.9 EURAXESS Jobs

There are currently **around 7400 research jobs** (all over Europe, but also in other countries such as in Brazil and in all disciplines) announced on the <u>EURAXESS Jobs database</u>. Opportunities can be viewed by country, level of seniority, field or research or via free text searches.

Please note that these jobs also include **doctoral positions**, including those funded by the Marie Sklodowska Curie Actions (MSCA – ITN) and by the European Research Council (ERC).

2.1 National EURAXESS Portals

2.2 BELGIUM (Wallonie-Bruxelles) – <u>FNRS incoming</u> calls

2.2.1 <u>Fund for research training in industry and agriculture FRIA grant</u>

Support for the completion of the Ph.D. within 4 years. in a university of the French-speaking Community of Belgium in industry and agriculture

Eligible applicants are holders of a master degree (obtained maximum 7 years ago) in one or many fields below: Art of Building and Urban Planning, Medical Sciences, Public Health Sciences (except for Human and Social Sciences disciplines and the likes), Veterinary Sciences, Dental Sciences, Biomedical and Pharmaceutical Sciences, Motricity Sciences, Sciences, except for Tourism Studies and Management and Geographic Sciences (Human or Social Sciences disciplines and the likes), Agronomic Sciences and Biological Engineering, Technology and Engineering Sciences.

Deadline: 29 August 2017.

2.2.2 <u>Human Sciences Research Fund FRESH</u> grants

The FRESH Fund supports basic research projects whose outcomes are likely to improve the understanding or functioning of one sector in the society in the short-medium term at a local, regional, national or international level, from many perspectives such as economy, politics, culture etc. The granting of FRESH grants is intended for the completion of the Ph.D. within 4 years in a university of the French-speaking Community of Belgium under the supervision of a promoter permanently appointed or on probation

Eligible applicants are holders of a master degree (obtained maximum 7 years ago) in one or many of the following fields: Philosophy, Theology, Language and Literature, and Translation Studies History, Art History and Archaeology, Art of Building and Urban Planning, Information and communication, Political and social Sciences, Juridical Sciences, Criminology, Economical and management Sciences, Psychology and Educational Sciences, Arts and Sciences, Tourism Studies and Management, Public Health Sciences, Geographic Sciences, Environmental Sciences and Management.

Deadline: 29 August 2017.



FRESH grants are strictly restricted to graduates with an academic education who aim to carry out fundamental research projects with significant societal impact, using tools provided by human and social sciences.



2.3 DENMARK – <u>Industrial PhD and post doc</u> <u>Programmes (Incoming)</u>

The **Industrial PhD programme** is funded by the Innovation Fund Denmark. An industrial PhD project is a **three-year industrially focused PhD** project where the student is hired by a company and enrolled at a university at the same time. The company receives a monthly wage subsidy while the university has its expenses for supervising covered. The PhD student works full time on the project and divides his/her time equally between the company and the university.

Innovation Fund Denmark invests in research projects within **all research fields**, provided the research project is of a high quality and is commercially relevant to the company.

Candidates of **any nationality**, holding or expecting to hold soon a **master's** degree with excellent records may apply.

Deadlines for reg. Industrial Postdoc and reg. Industrial PhD: **25 September 2017**; Public sector Industrial Researcher projects: **9 October 2017**

2.4 FRANCE (Ifremer) – <u>Call for candidates for the</u> 2017-2018 post-doctoral grants (Incoming)

Ifremer offers post-doctoral positions to young French or **foreign scientists** who have **completed their PhD**. and are motivated by development and innovation in various fields of Marine Sciences: technology and ecotechnology, aquaculture, fisheries, environment, risks analysis, physics of oceans, etc.

Postdoctoral positions are contracted for a duration of **12 months**, possibly renewable for a non-renewable 6-month period.

Deadline: 9 September 2017.

2.5 FRANCE – <u>PRESTIGE Postdoc programme</u> (Incoming and outgoing)

The PRESTIGE programme, coordinated by **Campus France**, aims at fostering the international mobility of post-doc researchers.

Three mobility schemes are available:

- Incoming, allowing foreign researchers to carry out their postdoctoral research work in France;
- Outgoing, for researchers from France wishing to carry out a postdoctoral research project in another country;
- Re-integration, targeted at nationals of EU Member States or Associated Countries working in research for at least 3 years in another Third Country to come to France to further develop their career.

PRESTIGE is a co-financing programme, funding about 1/3 of the post-doc fellow's living, mobility and research allowance, while the remaining 2/3 are financed by another partner, either public or private.

WHO? Any post-doc level researcher complying with the Marie Curie Actions mobility rules (not have resided or carried out his/her main activity - work, studies, etc. - in the country of his/her host organisation for more than 12 months in the three years immediately prior to the application deadline) may apply for funding through PRESTIGE programme. Furthermore, each applicant has to secure co-financing for his/her PRESTIGE mobility from the host



The PRESTIGE programme is co-financed under the Marie Curie Actions-COFUND of the FP7.

organisation (for Incoming and Re-integration schemes) or sending organisation (for the Outgoing scheme).

Note that 24-month PRESTIGE co-financing grants under the Incoming and Reintegration mobility schemes may only be awarded to successful applications submitted by the 30/9/2017 cut-off date, and intended for postdoctoral fellowships in France (and related work contracts) starting on 01/12/2017 at the very latest. For later contract start dates and for later cut-off dates, co-financing grants for shorter durations, between 12 and 23 months, may be awarded instead. Please note that no Incoming or Re-integration mobility co-financing grant shall be awarded for less than 12 months.

Deadline: 30 September 2017

2.6 FRANCE (Grenoble) – <u>Lanef PhD Programme 2017</u> (Incoming)

3 Calls: LANEF, GreQuE and QuEnG

LANEF PhD Program is a **three year programme** to support PhD training of excellent students. The thesis will be prepared in one of the five laboratories on a topic related to one or several of the following thematics:

- Photonics and semiconductors
- Spintronics and nanomagnetism
- Quantum nanoelectronics
- Breakthroughs for electrical energy
- Advanced superconductivity
- New frontiers in cryogenics
- Nanosensors and nanomaterials for health and biology
- Theoretical and Computational Physics.

The net salary is 1450 €/month during 36 months, including healthcare insurance (income tax not deduced). If you agree to undertake light additional duties (such as teaching, for example), your net salary may be risen up to 1690 €/month.

Eligibility

The programme is open to highly talented and motivated students of **any nationality**. Students from different backgrounds (biology, chemistry, physics, engineering, mathematics) who can demonstrate a strong interest in the fields of LANEF are welcome. Applicants should have a **master's degree and must be fluent in English language.** A good mobility (within the country of origin - or internationally) demonstrated during the undergraduate course will be considered as a plus.

They must have already found a PhD supervisor in one of the 5 laboratories of LANEF and be able to propose a thesis project in agreement with his/her future thesis supervisor.

A thesis project based on synergies between the 5 laboratories or the different thematics, will have a greater chance to be selected by our evaluation committee - also if it aims at enhancing collaborations with R&D, healthcare laboratories, or companies.

The 2017 call of the PhD programmes is enlarged with **two others funding possibilities** which bear some common aspects with the LANEF call (applicants must have a Masters degree for example) and some peculiarities. Please check out the details of each call:



LANEF is a 'Laboratoire d'Excellence' that associates five fundamental research labs based in Grenoble: Institut Néel, INAC, G2ELab, LNCMI and LPMMC. It coordinates 740 scientists, engineers, technicians, and 400 PhD students and postdocs, in condensed matter, nanosciences, and electrical engineering.



Grenoble Quantum Engineering (GreQue) doctoral programme has received funding from the European Union's Horizon 2020 research and innovation programme under the Marie Sklodowska-Curie agreement No 754303. It will provide the laureates with a double training involving fundamental research in toplevel laboratories and strong industrial exposure through internships within our network of industrial partners.



The Coimbra Group Brazilian Universities (CGBU) is composed of 77 Brazilian Higher Education Institutions. 3.4 BRAZIL – ISRAEL <u>4th Joint Call for Proposals for Research and Development (R&D) Projects</u> between Brazilian and Israeli Companies

Israel and Brazil announce a Call for proposals for **joint R&D projects between Israeli and Brazilian companies**, aimed at developing innovative products, services, processes or methods in all technology areas and in sectors with strong market potential.

The Israel Innovation Authority will support Israeli companies through access to public funding for joint projects.

Eligible Brazil applicants are:

- Brazilian companies of any size, registered, based and operating in Brazil
- Research institutions accredited as EMBRAPII Units and Poles are eligible to participate and use the resources of EMBRAPII, observing the required participation of one Brazilian company that will make a partnership with the Israeli side.
- Brazilian research institutions outside the EMBRAPII System are also eligible to participate, and are eligible for direct support from the FAPs, provided that they are partners with a Brazilian company.
- In the case of BNDES-only support, Brazilian research institutions are eligible only as subcontractors to the applying companies.

Eligible Israel applicants are:

- R&D performing companies of any size, registered, based and operating in Israel
- Research institutions as subcontractors to eligible companies

Considering the Memorandum Understanding on bilateral cooperation in research, development and innovation signed by the governments of Brazil and Israel, both countries the present following programme in which each government will provide support to their respective companies involved in joint R&D projects, once approved by both sides.

The program is jointly coordinated by the Secretariat for Innovation and New Business of the Ministry of Industry, Foreign Trade and Services of Brazil (hereinafter MDIC) and the Israel Innovation Authority (hereinafter IIA).



The joint funders seek interdisciplinary proposals from UK-Brazil networks that aim to address health systems challenges in Brazil. Proposals must describe how and why the proposed UK-Brazil network would be best placed to develop projects that would have the potential to improve the health of vulnerable communities in Brazil.

- Provide evidence that is of direct relevance to decision makers and users in the field.

Brazilian applicants should refer to CONFAP's eligibility rules for this call.

Please note it is important to check that the relevant Brazilian State Funding Agency ("FAP") is participating in this call – not all Brazilian FAPs have agreed to participate. The participants FAPs of this call for proposal are: FACEPE, FAPDF, FAPEAL, FAPEG, FAPEMA, FAPEMIG, FAPEPI, FAPESC, FAPESP, FAPESQ, FAPITEC, FAPT, FUNCAP e FUNDECT.

Some FAPs may have their own Guidelines associated to this Announcement. Interested parties are advised to consult with their supporting FAP before preparing a proposal.

Researchers from the State of São Paulo must consult the FAPESP Guidelines specific for this Announcement.



Collaborations should focus on a single project involving an overseas-based scientist ("the Applicant") and a UK-based scientist ("the Co-applicant").





BRAZIL (Fapesp) – UK (BBSRC) joint funding of research: Collaborative research proposals in any area of science that is within the remit of both BBSRC and FAPESP.Deadline: 4 October 2017

BRAZIL (FAPESP) - UK (BBSRC) —pump-priming awards for new collaborations between research groups in the State of São Paulo, Brazil and BBSRC funded research groups in the UK. Priority will be given to applications in the area of food security and/or Bioenergy and Industrial Biotechnology. Applications must be made by a Principle Investigator (PI) currently in receipt of BBSRC research funding. Deadline: anytime.

BRAZIL (CAPES) – GERMANY (Humboldt) Researcher Fellowships. For postdoctoral researchers and experienced researchers from Brazil who have completed their doctorate in the last four years to carry out a long-term research project with Germany and for researchers from Brazil who completed their doctorate less than twelve years ago and work at least at the level of Assistant Professor or Junior Research Group Leader, or have a record of several years of independent academic work. Next deadline: 28 July 2017.
